## **David Vaughan Exhibition**

Friday 13 to Sunday 22 September

The Revd David Vaughan was an influential figure in Leicester during the latter half of the nineteenth century. Vaughan was the founder of the Working Men's Institute – later Vaughan College – and strove to improve the education of working people in Leicester. From Friday 13 to Sunday 22 September, Leicester Cathedral will play host to an exhibition exploring the rise of workers' education in 19th century Leicester and the part that David Vaughan played in this.

## **Reconciliation: September-November**

This is work made in Derry/Londonderry and takes us back to the Northern Irish Troubles and forward to the costs and imagination required to build peace in Ireland and indeed anywhere. Lord Eames, former Archbishop of Armagh, will give a lecture on 18 September with tickets costing £3.00 on the door or available in advance.

We will also host again the Museum of the Moon from 11-20 October with a full programme of events and activities every day and evening during those ten days. This is a huge opportunity for us. Please let your friends know about it. Please come along or if you have any spare time, we need literally hundreds of volunteers hours to cover those days. Do let any of us know if you can help.

Finally, we will conclude the Season on Fri 29 November 19:30-21:45 with a Ceilidh (adults £6.00 and under 18's £2.00). It will be a lot of fun with a live band (Moggy in the Wood) and a pay bar. It is ideal for all ages and no prior experience is needed. I can assure you that you don't need to be any good at dancing but instead just willing to have some fun.


## Free Tours and Exhibition

Proceeds from this lunch will be split between Women in Philanthropy and the outreach work of Leicester Cathedral in the City Centre.

Women in Philanthropy supports small charities and groups across Leicestershire & Rutland. WiP chooses three groups each year, all doing essential work to keep our city and counties healthy, safe and thriving. The three groups this year are **Dear Albert**, a substance abuse group in the City, **Out of Hours Club Rutland** giving young adults with extra needs a chance to enjoy the same leisure activities as their peers, and **Zinthiya Trust**, working on a needs-led basis to alleviate abuse and poverty in our area. A yearly membership of £500 is split into giving and long-term investment to future proof the WiP Fund. WiP's other role is to introduce the groups to new audiences, the development of confidence and skills in public speaking, and the provision of a short film for each group sponsored by De Montfort University. Together, the membership is making a real and lasting difference to our communities.

Lunch will take place in St Martins House and will include a soft drink with soup and a roll, followed by cheeseboard, coffee, and cake. Tickets are £15 and may be gift aided, as the cost of the lunch is less than 25% of the ticket price.
