Vacancy – Member of the Cathedral Chapter – Could this be for you?

Following the end of Jane Avery's term of office, there is a vacancy for a member of Chapter to be elected by those on the Cathedral's electoral roll. Chapter is, by Statute, the governing body of the Cathedral and has existed for 19 years in its present form. It has grown in confidence and skill, leading the Cathedral's vision process, engaging with difficult questions around the Cathedral's resourcing in order to increase our income, committing the Cathedral to playing a central part in enabling St Martins House to flourish as well as working on plans for the development of Cathedral Gardens and the re-ordering of the Cathedral itself.

Chapter, with 12 members, lay and ordained, meets at least 9 times a year, usually in the afternoon, beginning at 3pm and concluding in time for Evening Prayer at 5.30pm. There is normally an 'away day' (actually held in the Dean's Parlour!) annually to consider strategic issues. Chapter provides strategic leadership, and carries statutory responsibility for the worship, mission, pastoral care, finance, staffing and buildings of the Cathedral. All members of Chapter must be 'actual communicant members of the Church of England, resident in the diocese or who have their names on the church electoral roll of the diocese'. Chapter members are also required to undertake Safeguarding procedures. If this sounds like something that would interest you, please speak to the Dean, David Monteith as soon as possible.

This means that De Montfort University Chaplaincy will no longer have a permanent Anglican chaplain on site. Project Director's update

Getting the views of the public

From Wednesday to Sunday 5-10 June there will be a display in the south aisle outlining the background to the project and also the latest stage in the development of our plans for the building itself, including the new heritage learning centre. People will be invited to complete a simple response card which will help us understand what the general impressions are and any detailed comments they may choose to make. This is a separate exercise from that recently carried out by our Activity Planners, which was more about what we will do from the base of our re-shaped cathedral. It will help us refine our designs, as we move towards submitting for planning permission both locally and with the Cathedrals Fabric Commission for England. I do hope all members of the congregation will feel able to join in with this exercise.



Stonework repairs pressing on

I recently visited the stone-yard to see Alan, the mason, busily engaged in carving our two grotesques. The picture below shows the Fox, which is nearing completion – the Tiger will follow on and if you look carefully you can the small-scale model that Alan is working from.

New Street Car Park

The New Street car park (a facility managed by our partners at St Martins House) has now reopened following resurfacing. At present, parking on Monday to Friday is restricted to permit holders only, but on Saturdays and Sundays it is open from 7am to 6pm at the following rates:

Saturdays – arrive before midday £5, arrive after midday £3.

Sunday – £3 all day. Please pay the attendant.

Parking is subject to space being available and all vehicles are left at the owner's risk. The gates will be locked at 6pm each day.

Please note that the car park will not be available at all on the weekend of 9-10 June and there will be some restrictions on the weekend of 16-17 June.

Access to New Street

The City Council have been busy upgrading the Greyfriars area south of the Cathedral. The final phase of the works on New Street aims to be completed by October 2018. Vehicular access will be restricted during this time, and if you need access for parking you will need to enter from Peacock Lane. The Council will be operating the street in a two-way direction assisted by Traffic Marshalls during the working day.
