On Sunday we would arrive at 10:30 for Matins at 11:00 and 3:45 for Choral Evensong. With practice for Nave Evensong beginning at 6:10, there was no time to go home between services, so we ate a picnic tea in the Song School and then entertained ourselves for the rest of the afternoon. Ordinations and the monthly Sung Eucharist made life even busier. At 4:45 on Monday afternoon we were back in the Song School practising for Choral Evensong (boys' voices) at 5:15. Tuesdays and Wednesdays we had off!

## **Thy Kingdom Come and The Bishop's Big Conversations**

One is the global wave of prayer known as 'Thy Kingdom Come' which the Archbishop of Canterbury is very keen on. The other is Bishop Martyn's Big Conversations, about which there is some information on the Diocesan website and for which we are planning various events. Do keep the dates in your diaries: TKC runs from 10 – 20 May and the Big Conversations 18 – 20 May. The Big Conversations with Bishop Martyn will explore how we talk about God and how we share our faith. The Bishop will be out and about, but also meeting with ourselves in various groups. Do you remember his call for Prayer and Parties, when he first arrived? Well, we're having an all age party that Saturday afternoon (19) – yes I know it's Cup Final day and the Royal wedding, but there's time for all of that as well as a

Cathedral family party organised by our very own creative Education Officer, Andy Heafford. More details in a future news sheet.

This year for TKC, among other things, we are planning from 14 – 18 to have as many ‘Artists’, in the broadest sense of the word, as possible working in the Cathedral or Gardens during the week. Hopefully this will be a very diverse project varying from Calligraphy to flower arranging, from painting to modelling, from embroidery to journaling with some sketching, printing and jewellery making in the mix as well plus anything you may do that I haven’t mentioned. We will be working around the theme of Stories of Jesus but you can choose your own story whatever story has meaning for you. I am sure there are many amazing skills out there that we know nothing about so don’t hide your light under a bushel come and join the party it will be great fun. I will set up 10 x 2 hour sessions during the week and nearer the time you can sign up for as many or few sessions as you feel able. It would be good to have an on-going list of willing participants. ## Activity Consultation Day – Sunday 22 April

Once the building work is done and dusted, a big part of the project will involve various strands of new activity that this all makes possible. In order to help us plan what these should be, and who we want to attract. Our Activity Planners, Julia Holbrook Associates, have been working with us since the start of the year helping get the best ideas for all of that. They will be with us on Sunday 22 April, between 12noon and 2.30pm, looking for our input to that process – both as a congregation, and also responses from the general public. It would be great if you could plan to be with us to have your say!

## Embracing a Different View

‘A Different View’ is the name of the Business Consultants we have appointed, who over the next 6 months will help us put together the sustainable plans that will inform how we aim to work not just for the duration of the Revealed project but for the next 10 years. They will ultimately report to Chapter in the autumn, but in the meantime will be working away with different parts of the Cathedral’s life to help them help us arrive at the best plans possible.

## RIBA 2 to RIBA 3

In my last update I said we were near to the end of the planning stage known as RIBA 2. This was presented both to the HLF and to Chapter at the beginning of the month - and both were broadly content. We are now reviewing the cost plans for all of this, to make sure what we want to do and what we expect to spend match each other properly at this stage of the project

And finally, British Science Week, with the Museum of the Moon, showed us just what we’re capable of as a cathedral, and just what a challenge it is to step up to, as we look for new ways to truly be a beating heart for city and county! 28,000 visitors were welcomed in 10 days – well done all concerned!

## New Street Car Park

The New Street car park (a facility managed by our partners at St Martins House) has now reopened following resurfacing. At present, parking on Monday to Friday is restricted to permit holders only, but on Saturdays and Sundays it is open from 7am to 6pm at the following rates payable by debit card or chip and pin only – **no cash**.

This is in order to protect our staff.

*Saturdays – arrive before midday £5, arrive after midday £3.*


