# Leicester Cathedral Revealed

## Mending the stones

The picture below shows scaffolding going up on the south and west faces of the Cathedral. This is for our long-awaited stonework repair work, funded by the last grants from the government's World War I Memorial fund for Cathedrals. Work starts now and will continue beyond Easter. There's a very interesting board on the front, showing exactly where we aim to work: the work now is labelled a pilot project, and is the precursor of more that we want to do in due course as part of the overall project.

## Design Development – from now to Easter

Our designs continue to develop, and on 11 January we had an informal visit from members of the Cathedrals Fabric Commission, to explore a few more key questions with them. We have a formal request for Advice in which will be considered on 25 January, so we can expect formal feedback after that. We will also be updating Chapter on latest plans later on 23rd January.

## What else is going on?

Julia Holberry Associates have begun work as our specialist Activity consultants, helping us work out more about what we will aim to be doing in our new buildings, and who the audiences are that we want to reach. We will be holding a consultation event, probably on a Sunday shortly after Easter, where you can all have a chance to have your say on that – their work is due for completion by early autumn. And the brief for a new whole Cathedral business plan has just gone out to tender, with an appointment anticipated in the first weeks of March.

### Toilets and Ancillary Rooms

These spaces are accessed via the door in St Dunstan's Chapel only via the assistance of one of our staff or authorised volunteers. ## New Street Car Park

The New Street car park (a facility managed by our partners at St Martins House) has now reopened following resurfacing. At present, parking on Monday to Friday is restricted to permit holders only, but on Saturdays and Sundays it is open from 7am to 6pm at the following rates payable by debit card or chip and pin only – **no cash**. This is in order to protect our staff.

*Saturdays – arrive before midday £5, arrive after midday £3.*

*Sunday – £3 all day. Please pay the attendant. Please be aware Debit Cards Only.*

Parking is subject to space being available and all vehicles are left at the owner's risk. The gates will be locked at 6pm each day.
