### New Head Choristers for the Boys and Junior Girls

The Head Choristers of the Boys' and Junior Girls' Choir moved to the Young Songmen and Senior Girls' Choir respectively over the summer and so we have new Head and Deputy-Head Choristers for both groups. We presented the new Head Chorister of the Junior Girls' Choir, Hattie Brooks, with her medal at the Eucharist on 23 September and today we do the same for Luca Calardo-Cooper.

Hattie's family have a long connection with Leicester Cathedral and Hattie is one of only a handful of choristers who've joined the choir through being part of the wider Cathedral community, rather than the other way round. Hattie was recruited from Chalk and first joined the group that we used to run on a Saturday morning, aged just five. She progressed from there to the Junior Girls' Choir when she was in Year Two, and such is her commitment to her singing that she's opted to sing with both the Junior and the Senior Girls this year, now that she's in Year Eight.

The new Deputy-Head Chorister of the Junior Girls' Choir is Imogen Wood, who also joined via the Saturday morning group. Her mother, Claire, is a stalwart supporter of music at the Cathedral as a Choir Chaperone and regular member of the Cathedral Chamber Choir.

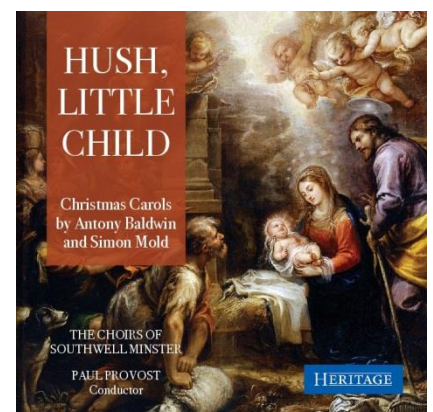
Luca Calardo-Cooper is a textbook case of how our schools' singing programme DioSing! can lead to membership of the Cathedral Choir for a talented young singer who might not otherwise have given it consideration. It was during our recruitment campaign in 2015 that Emma Trounson phoned me to say that she'd just taken her first session with a new group of singers at St Peter and St Paul Academy in Syston and that she'd noticed a singer who she thought was called Lukas and was in Year Three who was fantastic and had been given her star singer award for that session. I got on the phone to the head teacher straight away and discovered that his name was actually Luca and he was in Year Four. She in turn spoke to Luca's parents who by 6pm that evening had phoned up and booked him an audition. The rest, as they say is history!

The Boys' Choir will have two Deputy-Head Choristers, Tochukwu Magulike and Toby Frape, and Isaac Wiles, as the sole surviving Year Nine boy treble has been given the title Senior Chorister, in recognition of the leadership and example that he brings to the team.

### **Hush, Little Child - a new Christmas Carol CD**

A new release on the Heritage label, this CD features carols by Antony Baldwin and Simon Mold, one of our current Leicester Cathedral Songmen, performed by the Choirs of Southwell Minster. Simon has some advance copies available for any whose minds might just be turning to the question of Christmas presents! The 16 carols (plus a fun organ piece) are in a variety of styles and moods, ranging from robust rejoicings to gentle lullabies, but with an overall emphasis on tunefulness and "listenability".

### Diocesan Director of Ordinands and Canon Chancellor at Leicester Cathedral

The Bishop of Leicester is pleased to announce the appointment of the Revd Canon Paul Rattigan, Canon for Discipleship at Liverpool Cathedral, to the combined role of Diocesan Director of Ordinands and Canon Chancellor at Leicester Cathedral. The date of Paul's installation will be announced in due course.





Bishop of Loughborough, the Rt Revd Guli Francis-Dehqani – whose role includes that of Sponsoring Bishop, overseeing and supporting the vocations of those called to ordained ministry – also welcomed Paul’s appointment. Bishop Guli said: “I’m very excited about working with Paul who combines a real love for Cathedral ministry with a passion for vocations. He will be a great asset to the team here in Leicester and we’re looking forward to welcoming him.”

The Very Revd Dean of Leicester, David Monteith, said: “A third of Paul’s time will be spent on cathedral educational work. He will bring much experience in this area. As we welcome Paul, we pray he will thrive and help us become more of ‘a beating heart for city and county.’” Paul, who is married to Anne and has a daughter who lives with her family in Nottingham, has himself spoken of his connections to the Midlands and his commitment to both cathedrals and vocation. He said: “Vocations and discipleship have long been a passion of mine. Cathedrals are a more recent love but no less important in my calling to this new role. I grew up in the Midlands and then went to university where I studied various subjects before moving to Liverpool to teach Maths and Psychology. It was here that my call to ordained ministry crystallised and I was ordained in 1995 at Liverpool Cathedral. “Since then I have served in various parishes from inner city to suburbia in both Birmingham and Liverpool. I was delighted to return to Liverpool five years ago to become Canon for Discipleship but surprised to find myself at the cathedral which is not my background at all. Since then cathedrals have gotten under my skin and I have thoroughly enjoyed being able to focus on discipleship. “Having been involved in careers guidance before ordination, I quickly became part of the vocations team during my curacy and have continued this for over 20 years. Firstly becoming Examining Chaplain, then Diocesan Vocations Adviser and currently a BAP adviser as well as working closely with St Mellitus North West.

Therefore, when I saw this post where I could more fully serve within the vocations field as well as keeping my love of cathedrals and discipleship going I felt a definite call to this post. “There are changes currently going on within the discernment and training for ordained ministry and new ones for the future. I am looking forward to being part of a newly formed team, walking with people, as together we discern what God is doing in their lives. “I will be sad to leave Liverpool and our friends but my overarching impression of Leicester, and the people I met during the interview process, was how hospitable everyone was. I am very excited about getting to know new friends and a new area.”

We welcome the Revd Canon Andrew Dodd who will be with us from 29 October-9 November. Andrew has been Rector of Grimsby Minster since 2011 and he is also the Area Dean of North East Lincolnshire. ## **Gender Equality: 100 Years on from the Representation of the People Act, where are we today?**

Public Lecture by Baroness Shami Chakrabarti, Shadow Attorney General.  
Thursday 15 November, 6.30pm - 7.30pm, University of Loughborough

Shami Chakrabarti is the Shadow Attorney General and a member of the House of Lords. A lawyer, she is Honorary Professor of Law at the University of Manchester, Honorary Fellow of Mansfield College, Oxford and a Master of the Bench of Middle Temple. She was previously Chancellor of both Oxford Brookes University and then the University of Essex. Shami also received an honorary doctorate from Loughborough University in 2005. Baroness Chakrabarti was Director of Liberty, the National Council for Civil Liberties from 2003 to 2016, and a member of the panel of the Leveson Inquiry, the judicial inquiry into UK phone hacking in 2011. Called to the Bar in 1994 she worked as a lawyer in the Home Office from 1996 until 2001 for Governments of both persuasions. The lecture is free, but you need to register for tickets on Eventbrite:

# Leicester Cathedral Revealed

## Project Director's update

Following a period of design review for the Heritage Learning Centre over the summer, Chapter endorsed a revised approach to the external massing and appearance of this part of the building at its meeting on 29th October. This new approach has the broad support of all our key stakeholders, including the city council, who the Revealed team have kept briefed throughout the process.

This new-look Heritage Learning Centre will enhance the cathedral and its historic setting, whilst still offering much-needed extra facilities that will ensure that we can properly welcome the many visitors to our cathedral and city. We are also looking closely at proposals for a new oratory (space for private prayer or counsel) in the main cathedral, which will offer something special for those of our visitors looking for a quieter space, when life is very busy all around.

Plans to submit a Round Two application for significant funding to the Heritage Lottery Fund in the first week of December remain on course and we look forward to a final decision in March 2019 and a hoped for start on site next summer.

## Buy a Lunch, Give a Lunch 2018

Thursday 22 November 2018 | 12.30pm

Proceeds from this lunch will be split between The Bridge and the outreach work of Leicester Cathedral in the City Centre. This year the Cathedral has focused on work with asylum seekers and refugees, and building the Leicester Citizens Alliance in the city to work together for the common good.

The Bridge is an outreach to the lost and lonely of Leicester, to the homeless and to those who have nowhere to go and no one to turn to. Based at Melton Street, they support some of the most marginalised people in the City with complex problems in addition to, or as a direct result of, homelessness. Since 2009, The Bridge has grown to deliver various specialist services, alongside an expanded hot food service.
