Choir Farewells

This morning's service is the Cathedral Choir's last before the summer break and, as always at this time of year, we say an official goodbye and thank-you to those who will be leaving the choir sometime between now and the start of university term in the autumn. Michael Clarke joined the Cathedral Choir as a Young Songman in February 2017, having previously sung with the choir of St Andrew's, Aylestone, both as a treble and on the back row. He very quickly settled into the Cantoris basses, where his warmth of tone in the lower registers has been a real bedrock for the sound of the choir as a whole. Michael is not only a gifted singer, but also an accomplished clarinettist, who recently got a distinction for his Grade Eight, the cost of his lessons having been supported in part by one of the scholarship that the Cathedral makes available to Young Songmen. He has a place at Nottingham University to study Electrical and Electronic Engineering and will sing as a Choral Scholar at St Mary's Church in the city.

Clarissa Wells first came to my attention when I accompanied her Grade Five singing exam just before Christmas 2013: I liked what I heard and, since there was space in the Senior Girls' Choir at that time, invited her to join.



We were fortunate that she decided to stay in Leicester for her degree and extend our warmest congratulations to her on having recently been awarded a B.A. in Education Studies with Upper Second Class honours from De Montfort University, her dissertation for which was supervised by our very own Motje Wolf. As well as having become a real leader among the Cantoris sopranos, Clarissa has been an important part of the social side of choir life and is referred to affectionately by some of the others as 'Granny', purely on account of her being a year or two their senior and therefore the other side of twenty. Also leaving this term is Elizabeth Nattrass, to whom we made a presentation a couple of Sundays ago, as she moved down to Devon as soon as she finished her A-levels, as her parents have recently left the teaching profession to open a hotel there (I'm still waiting for the address, as we've yet to book our summer holiday). Then aged 12, Elizabeth was one of the oldest singers to join the choir through our 'Sing for the King!' campaign held in the spring of 2013 and, after just a term in the Junior Girls' Choir, moved up to the Senior Girls' Choir the following summer, where she's been a mainstay of the first soprano line ever since, particularly over the past year. Like Clarissa, she's sung some memorable solos, including the Pie Jesu from the Fauré Requiem in 2016. Elizabeth is taking a gapyear, during which she'll be working at a Catholic Youth Retreat Centre in Derbyshire, and hopes thereafter to study Architecture in Lincoln. Clarissa, Michael, Elizabeth, thank you for all that you have given to the musical life of Leicester Cathedral during your time in the choir.

We wish you all the very best for the exciting future that lies ahead and you go with our love and prayers. It is also appropriate at this point to express, on behalf of the Cathedral community, our heartfelt thanks to the families of these and indeed all our singers for the support they have given, and continue to give, to the choir. Without the (grand-)parental taxi service, there would be no singers and without singers, there would be no choir. Thank you for all that you do; it really isn't taken for granted.

Farewell Julie Tyler

Our final goodbye is somewhat overdue, since Julie Tyler actually left us in the spring as part of the restructuring of the Cathedral admin team. Julie first joined us as the Administrator for the Chorister Outreach Programme, which started under my predecessor Jonathan Gregory, and became Music Department Administrator when the successor to that programme, DioSing!, was set up in 2012. There's so much that she's been involved with since then that it's difficult to know where to start, but perhaps exemplary for diligence with which she fulfilled all the different tasks I threw her way is the painstaking annual round of phone calls to local primary schools each spring to arrange my recruitment visits, without which the Cathedral Choirs would not have half as many members as they do today.



This is the first occasion since Julie left when all the different groups of the Cathedral Choirs have been in attendance and we didn't want anyone to miss out on extending our thanks to her for all that she's done.

Journey in Faith

From the recent Bishop's Conversations, the ordinations season, Partnership for Missional Church, our strategic planning and most importantly through conversations, the question of how is God calling us, collectively and as individuals is constantly in the air. And so it should be!

At this forthcoming time of year, when many transition in life, from or to school, college or University, new opportunities emerge and lives will settle into routines following the summer holiday, and as many plan their autumn and winter activities, here is a question for you to consider. How is God calling you to explore your faith and deepen your discipleship?

The Journey in Faith course is a year-long evening course. Leicester Cathedral Revealed

Project Director's update

After the Fox, the Tiger

The Tiger has now joined the Fox in place up at high level on the south-west face of the cathedral, behind the hoardings.

We now expect these to be removed from week beginning 23 July, and we will all be able to see not only those two great new characters, but also the full extent of stonework repairs carried out since we started on site last January.

What about the main Project?

We continue to press on through this crucial Development phase with architects and allied disciplines working on design

and our fund-raising team doing what they do. We recently submitted further plans to CFCE for Advice at their forthcoming meeting to be held on 19 July. If all goes well, we then have a deadline of the end of August to finalise plans for both them and the local authority, asking for formal planning consent.

Back at the end of 2016 myself and Lynette Maple, then senior warden, asked you, the congregation for some indication of financial commitment to the project before we first went to the Heritage Lottery Fund to seek their support, and were very grateful for the response at the time, which I know helped impress the HLF Trustees as they set us on our way. As we prepare to go back to HLF for our full round two approval at the end of the year, we'd like to invite you once more to indicate to us whatever financial support is possible for you. More of that on Sunday 15 July.

Toilets and Ancillary Rooms

These spaces are accessed via the door in St Dunstan's Chapel only via the assistance of one of our staff or authorised volunteers. New Street Car Park

The New Street car park (a facility managed by our partners at St Martins House) has now reopened following resurfacing. At present, parking on Monday to Friday is restricted to permit holders only, but on Saturdays and Sundays it is open from 7am to 6pm at the following rates:

Saturdays – arrive before midday £5, arrive after midday £3. Sunday – £3 all day. Please pay the attendant.

Parking is subject to space being available and all vehicles are left at the owner's risk. The gates will be locked at 6pm each day.

Please note there will be restricted access to the New Street Car Park on **Sunday 12 August**, this is due to a large event taking place in Cathedral Gardens between 11am – 4pm.

Access to New Street

The City Council have been busy upgrading the Greyfriars area south of the Cathedral. The final phase of the works on New Street aims to be completed by October 2018. Vehicular access will be restricted during this time, and if you need access for parking you will need to enter from Peacock Lane. The Council will be operating the street in a two-way direction assisted by Traffic Marshalls during the working day.
