Mission

The Gospel speaks of welcome for all, especially the most vulnerable, into a Church which affirms the value and dignity of every human and those in positions of responsibility and authority are truly trustworthy.

Being faithful to this therefore compels us to take with the utmost seriousness the challenge of preventing abuse from happening and responding well where it has.

If you have concerns

Children, young people and adults

If you have a concern about an individual's physical, sexual, emotional or spiritual well-being, it is **your** responsibility to seek advice and support from your the Cathedral Safeguarding Coordinators (CSC) or the duty Canon.

Clergy, staff, volunteers or other Cathedral officers

Any safeguarding concerns or allegations about anyone in a Cathedral role must be immediately reported to a Cathedral Canon or the Diocesan Safeguarding Officer (DSA).

If you or someone close to you (e.g. a partner or someone you live with) becomes involved in any police or Social Services investigation, you must seek advice from a Canon or the DSA immediately.

A member of the congregation

Any safeguarding concerns or allegation must be immediately reported to a CSC or a Canon.

Please be assured that all matters will be dealt with confidentially by the Cathedral and reported to the police and/or social services as required to protect those who are vulnerable from harm.

Remember

Dos and don'ts for handling a disclosure

Don't worry if you only get part of a story. An investigation will be undertaken by a trained person.

Do

- Remain calm, approachable and receptive
- Take it seriously
- Listen carefully, without interrupting
- Acknowledge you understand how difficult this may be
- Offer reassurance it is the right thing to tell someone
- Tell them what will happen next
- Make a written record of exactly what has been said and when
- Report promptly

Don't

- Promise complete confidentially
- Ask leading or probing questions
- Investigate
- Discuss with people who do not need to know
- Delay in reporting the disclosure to a CSC or the duty Canon

Reporting concerns

Is there an emergency? Is there an immediate risk of harm?





Contact the Police and inform the duty staff

Contact one of the Safeguarding Coordinators or the Cathedral Canons





Complete a written record promptly and forward it to the duty Canon



If necessary, the DSA will be informed, manage the response, report to statutory agencies and support the Cathedral
