

Talk: **Stories from Sikh and Punjab History** found in the Abbeys, Cathedrals and Churches of the UK

Thursday 25 April | 6.30-8.30pm

Britain's streets are full of stories from Sikh and Punjabi history. Rav Singh brings these stories to life through A *little History of the Sikhs* – a community initiative he founded that works to translate research in modern-day Sikh history and heritage into walking tours in London, day trips in the South-East of England and annual study visits to destinations in the UK and across western Europe.

Rav will be presenting stories from Sikh and Punjab history that are memorialised in Abbeys, Cathedrals, and Churches across the South-East of England in this talk at Leicester Cathedral. The talk will be followed by a question and answer session and refreshments.

lain McKillop's Stations of the Resurrection

Perspectives of Christ's resurrection

3 April – 20 May

lain McKillop is a British painter and art-historian working mainly in the field of Christian religious art, with his work regularly touring British cathedrals and churches. He also produces paintings of architectural history and related subjects.

Resurrection Stations explore the accounts of witnesses who were convinced of Jesus' return to life – a further dimension of existence beyond death.

McKillop hopes to make us consider the evidence of the Gospel accounts, the implications of Jesus' resurrection, and what aspects might convince us to trust in God and Christ's teachings today.

In the Gospels, Jesus asks 307 questions. He is asked around 183 questions, but only answers three. In fact, Jesus often responded to a question with another question! Asking questions can empower us to learn and grow in our faith, but it can feel challenging, and finding answers can also be difficult.

Our monthly discussion group aims to offer a friendly space to ask questions (and practise giving answers!) about faith and discipleship. Everyone is welcome and there is no need to book a place. Join us as we ask, wonder, and share together!

Wednesday 21 February (for five weeks) | In-person and on Zoom Lent Course: 'The Wilderness of the World'

What can we learn from examples of 'wilderness' in the Bible as we look to navigate the places, experiences and issues in our contemporary world where we feel a sense of isolation and struggle? Although we may feel hopeless in the face of some of the biggest issues facing our world today – the climate crisis, poverty, injustice, exploitation, exclusion – what practical things can we do to make a difference for those caught in places and situations that could be considered a kind of contemporary 'wilderness'?

During this year's Lent course, guided by the themes of wilderness within scripture, together we will reflect on the hope that God offers in situations that feel hopeless, and we will identify some of the practical things we can do to help make a difference in our world as part of our discipleship.

Join us for a 5-week journey through Lent as we listen, share and grow together.

Leicester Cathedral Revealed







Leicester Cathedral Revealed is renewing the Cathedral so it can be its very best as a place of worship, heritage, pilgrimage, hospitality, learning, sanctuary and celebration.

The project has completed repair and restoration of the Cathedral building to secure the fabric for the long term, including:

- Conservation of external stonework
- A new stone floor, level throughout, with energy-efficient underfloor heating
- Replaced failing infrastructure such as boilers, electrical system
- Installed new lighting and AV
- Plaster repairs and redecoration
- Created a new ramped access from Guildhall Lane to the North Porch

The project is also constructing a new Heritage & Learning Centre, a striking extension to the Cathedral that will open in late summer 2024. This will provide an exhibition gallery with immersive interpretation, a flexible learning space for school children and community groups, and WCs.

Leicester Cathedral Revealed will realise our vision to restore the Cathedral building, renew its sacred spaces, and reaffirm the Cathedral's place at the centre of a resurgent City and County.



Toilets & accessibility

The entrance is currently on Guildhall Lane where you can find stepped and ramped access to the building. Our restoration project has installed a new level stone floor throughout the Cathedral.

Lighting in the Cathedral may be dim for certain events and during the evening.

There are currently no toilets in the building, but access to the toilets in St Martins House will be available to all Cathedral visitors. The facilities include baby changing and an accessible toilet.
